Over the last 50 years, the loss of a suitable breeding habitat has seen the Curlew suffer widespread declines across Europe, but nowhere has this been more severe than in Ireland. However, an EU project is making a difference in known breeding sites in Lough Corrib, Co Galway.

Carrownagappul Bog is one of the best examples of a raised bog West of the River Shannon.


Irish Agriculture received EU support worth over €1.7 billion in 2020. In Galway, basic payments to farmers alone amounted to over €87 million in 2019, with an average payment of €7,336 per recipient.

Chronic kidney disease is marked by the gradual destruction of kidney tissue over time and is a major cause of sickness and death in the EU. A spin out company from National University of Ireland Galway is investigating how stem cells can be expanded to use in human trials.
