BirdLife partners, RSPB (UK) and BirdWatch Ireland, have joined forces to put Europe's rarest breeding seabird, the roseate tern, on the road to recovery. The project won the Natura 2000 awards in 2018 and was one of the finalists in 2020. Rockabill Island in Skerries is a key breeding area.
