Bord na Móna is coordinating a major peatlands rehabilitation project funded by the European Union's LIFE Programme. The Peatlands and People project will contribute to the long-term implementation of Ireland's Climate Action Plan. A Peatlands Knowledge Centre of Excellence will focus on peatland restoration and rehabilitation.

Portlaoise has received funding of over €2 million from the EU to open a new low carbon centre of excellence. The Centre which will trade as 'The CUBE' will be the first dedicated low carbon facility in the region and will support and stimulate the creation of 260 jobs over the next 10 years.



Irish Agriculture received EU support worth over $\in 1.7$ billion in 2020. In Laois, basic payments to farmers alone amounted to over $\in 33$ million in 2019, with an average payment of $\in 12,704$ per recipient, which is the tenth largest in the country.


Saving the Hen Harrier

The Slieve Bloom Mountains are found on the border between Counties Offaly and Laois and it is now a Special Protected Area for the Hen Harrier. Much of the site is over 200 metres in altitude, rising to a maximum height of 527 metres at Arderin. The Hen Harrier Project is funded by the agricultural European Innovation Partnership (EIP-AGRI).
